***'Coaching People to Train Dogs: How to Conduct Effective Training Classes'***

This two day seminar will provide a fantastic foundation for experienced, new and aspiring instructors involved with adult education at puppy schools, pet obedience training and advanced competition classes. Information will include people skills, the various ways that people learn class organization and tips to structure classes as well as different ways to keep dogs in class quiet and stress-free!

Utilizing your area to the maximum, traffic control strategies, effective use of assistants, and options for last class activities will be covered. This seminar will be interactive. Attendees will get an idea of how effective various training techniques are by participating in exercises such as "Pavlov's Dog" and "What Humans Teach/What Canines Learn".

A variety of orientation strategies will be discussed. Should dogs attend the first night of class or should the first class be pupil free? Instructional formatting—what are your objectives, how do you measure your success? Should your course be time or goal driven? Should you offer one-skill classes? How about "levels" classes? What are the advantages of drop-in modules compared to the traditional linear class format?

Special attention will be paid to the environment, space, energy level of all present and exercises for the first class with dogs. The art of listening, learning to observe, effective communication, learning styles, lateral thinking and critical thinking exercises, depth and breadth of knowledge, criteria for selecting training techniques and equipment and what to do about dropout rates and, for 'experienced' instructors, how to reduce burnout!
